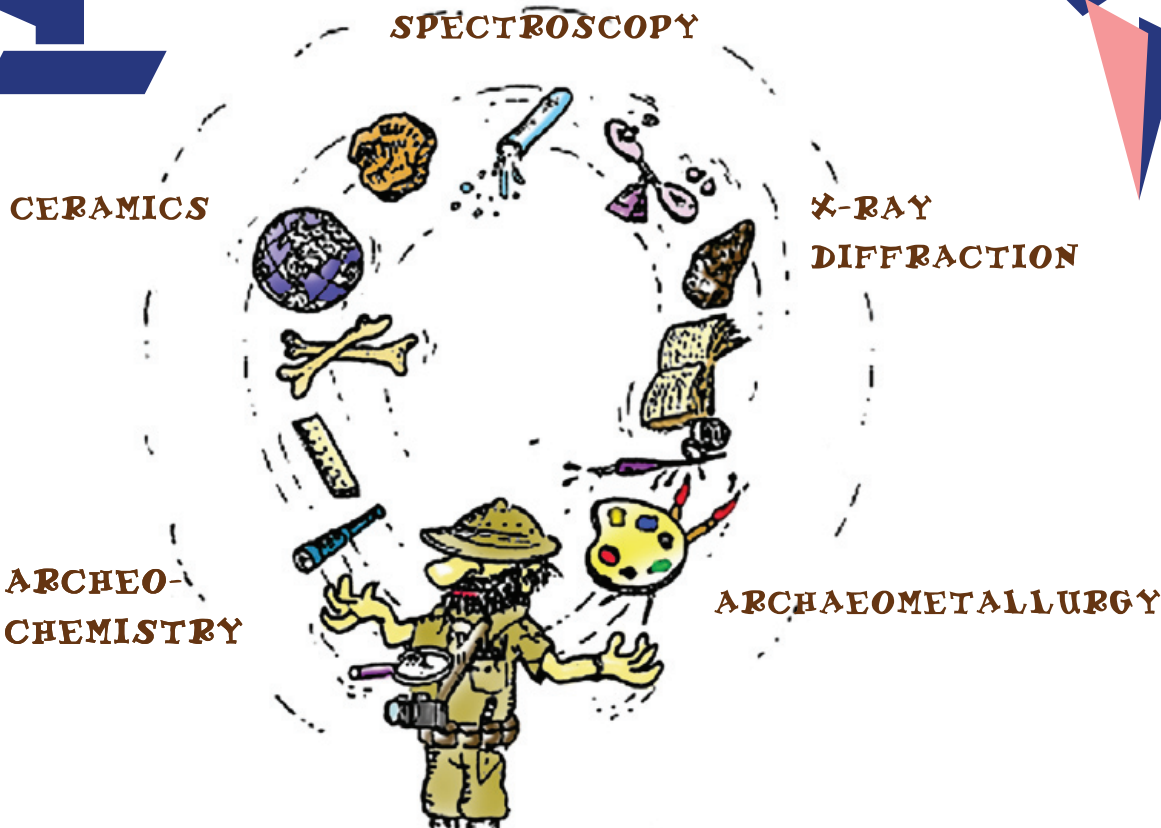
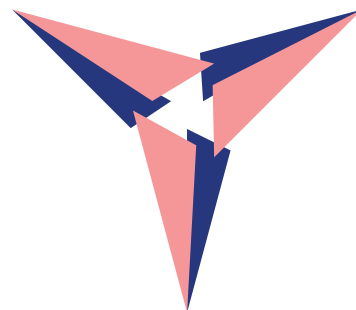


3rd Workshop on Science in Archaeology
